1.9 Tell us about your organisation and why it is suited for this grant (Maximum 250 words)	The Ecological Initiative of Salamina is a grassroots environmental organisation established in 2018 to enhance environmental awareness and mobilise participatory action in Salamina and the surrounding Argosaronic islands. We focus on community-led environmental protection, education, and sustainability. Our team has experience in designing and delivering school workshops, public campaigns, and environmental advocacy. With a strong network of local stakeholders, including educators, businesses, and NGOs, we are uniquely positioned to implement impactful projects. We believe that through education and action, especially in island communities where environmental pressures are acute, we can foster long-term positive change.

(Maximum 250 words)	The project will be led by Anna Papadaki, an experienced environmental educator and community organiser. Anna has coordinated several public engagement campaigns and school programs since 2019. She will be supported by two part-time environmental science graduates with field experience in marine pollution, and a graphic designer with a track record in producing educational materials. Volunteers from the Ecological Initiative will help deliver school workshops and coordinate beach cleanups. All team members have strong local ties and have collaborated on past awareness and citizen science projects in the region.

2.2 Project summary (Maximum 100 words)	A year-long environmental education and action initiative in Salamina, aiming to reduce plastic pollution through school workshops, public beach cleanups, and the creation of a local network of "Plastic-Free Champions." The project combines experiential learning, community involvement, and communication to raise awareness and inspire behavioural change.

(Maximum 100 words)	Plastic pollution is a major threat to Salamina's marine ecosystems, with large amounts of litter found on beaches and in shallow waters. The issue stems from inadequate waste management, high tourism activity, and lack of sustained environmental education. Our project addresses this by targeting local youth and community members through active engagement.

3. Project Implementation

3.1 Please describe the project including aims and objectives, methodologies and expected results. (Maximum 1000 words).

The "Seas Without Plastics" project seeks to reduce plastic waste in Salamina through education, direct action, and citizen engagement. Our main objectives are:

- To raise environmental awareness among young people.
- To activate the local community in addressing plastic pollution.
- To promote responsible business practices in relation to single-use plastics.

Methodology:

The project combines experiential learning, public events, and local partnerships. We will conduct five environmental education workshops in primary and secondary schools, using interactive methods such as beach litter audits and creative reuse activities. Three large-scale beach cleanups will engage the wider community and promote local stewardship. We will also establish a "Plastic-Free Champions" network by recruiting 10 local businesses to reduce single-use plastic usage and engage with 20 volunteers as project ambassadors.

Expected Results:

- 150+ students educated on plastic pollution and circular economy principles.
- 3 tons of waste removed from local beaches.
- 10 businesses implementing plastic-reduction practices.
- A growing network of engaged residents and youth volunteers.
- Educational materials distributed locally and online.

5. Risks

5.1 Describe any risks or uncertainties that might affect the project and how you will try to mitigate them. (Maximum 250 words)	Potential risks include low participation from schools or community members due to scheduling conflicts or lack of interest. To mitigate this, we will work closely with school administrations and local leaders to align activities with community calendars and promote the project through local media and personal networks. Weather conditions may also affect outdoor events; we will plan alternative indoor activities and schedule backup dates. Finally, there is a risk that businesses may hesitate to adopt plastic-free practices. We will address this by offering tailored support and showcasing early adopters as success stories to inspire others.
5.2 Could your project lead to any unintended negative consequences? (Maximum 250 words)	While the project is designed with positive outcomes in mind, there may be unintended consequences such as the temporary displacement of beach users during cleanup events or the mismanagement of collected waste. We will mitigate this by coordinating with local authorities to ensure proper scheduling, signage, and certified waste disposal. Additionally, we will ensure that volunteers are properly trained to handle materials safely and respectfully.
5.3 Are there any factors that may affect the timeline of your project? (Maximum 250 words)	Factors that could impact the timeline include school calendar changes, weather-related disruptions to outdoor events, and delays in material production. We have accounted for these by building flexibility into the project schedule and establishing buffer periods between major activities. The project team has prior experience adapting to such challenges, and regular monitoring will allow us to adjust timelines as needed without compromising outcomes.
